Why Saving Water and Winning Public Opinion Matters

Water conservation has always been an important topic in the green industry. In the early 70s, my father worked for the Farm Bureau in Illinois, and lobbied for environmental issues, including water conservation. At the time, this did not apply to golf courses—but that is no longer true.

Since I first joined the golf course industry, the public has held the belief that golf courses waste water. However, this is not the case. Our industry is at the forefront of water conservation, and we got here by developing and utilizing products with conservation in mind. Products such as:

Rotors with improved distribution, uniformity and scheduling coefficients.

- Improved irrigation design with a focus on maximizing conservation opportunities

Central control packages capable of making watering adjustments when and where they are needed

Grass variety selections that are appropriate to local climates

Conservation by the numbers

Today, golf courses conserve water and irrigate smartly better than before. The numbers back this up. Here are some highlights from surveys by the USGA Water Resource Center and GCSAA operations surveys:

- Golf courses use less water today. Usage in 2013 was 21 percent less than total usage in 2005.
- Golf courses irrigate with just 1.44 percent of all irrigated water in the U.S.
- About 65 percent of golf course facilities in the U.S have upgraded their irrigation systems in the last 10 years.
- Fewer than 15 percent of U.S. golf courses use municipal water as a supply for golf course irrigation.

About 12 percent of U.S. golf courses use recycled water for irrigation.

These numbers are a good and promising start, and they go back to my first point: what more can we do to improve the public's perception of how golf courses use water?

Get involved today

We as members of the golf course maintenance community must be ready to engage with the members at our club and the public as well. GCSAA advocates on your behalf at the local, state and national levels of government. And you as a member of STGCSA must be proactive in our region. Take advantage of tools like community service postings and regulatory bill trackers. If we all do are part, we can show the golf community and the public we are concerned stewards of our most valuable resource....water.

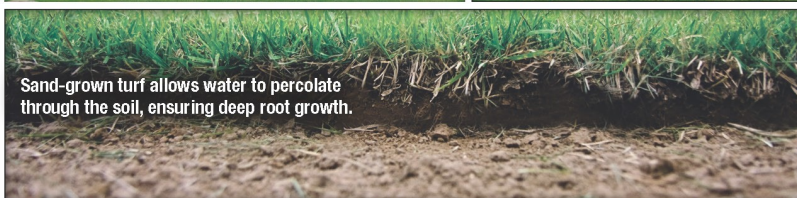

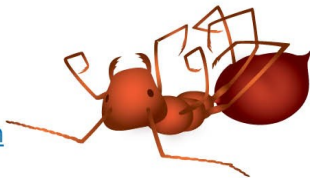

Westwood Golf Club Superintendent Strengthens Business Skills with Colleagues Across U.S.

Wesley Curtis, golf course superintendent at Westwood Golf Club in Houston, Texas was one of 26 superintendents across the country to graduate from the Syngenta Business Institute™ (SBI). SBI is an exclusive professional development program for golf course superintendents hosted by Syngenta and the Wake Forest University School of Business in Winston-Salem, North Carolina.

While agronomic expertise is critical to superintendent success, Syngenta also recognizes the need to provide superintendents with business management skills.

In case you missed it....

Sometimes an extreme, rapid drop in temperature across waterlogged turf can kill grass just as surely as a prolonged period of dense ice cover.



Weather patterns during the latter half of 2016 created stressful conditions for turf at golf courses throughout the Central Region and there was no letup for the holidays. A steady drop in temperatures during mid to late fall followed by consistent snow cover is ideal for preparing cool-season turf for winter hibernation. Unfortunately, several extreme temperature swings occurred during the middle of December – lows of zero degrees Fahrenheit preceded a rapid, wet warmup into the 50s and 60s that was followed by another cold snap. Those with cool-season turf could do little but wonder if the weather had killed or weakened grasses – e.g., *Poa annua* or perennial ryegrass – that have little tolerance for rapid freeze and thaw cycles. Those with warm-season turf were scrambling to cover and insulate bermudagrass greens when the frigid air moved south, plunging deep into the heart of Texas.

The good news is that cool-season turf has the greatest cold tolerance during early winter, so stressful weather patterns are far less likely to cause turf injury during December than during March. However, injury from cold temperatures or crown hydration is more difficult to predict than injury caused by long periods of ice cover. Refer to the article, "Winterkill – Causes and Prevention" for more detailed information regarding turfgrass cold tolerance and the processes of hardening and dehardening.

Are you wondering if Santa delivered winter injury to your golf course? For peace of mind, it never hurts to take a few turf samples from areas that have a history of winter injury and see if they green up under grow lights. The short webcast, "Sampling Greens for Winterkill" describes a simple procedure for collecting turf samples from frozen soil and testing them for winter injury.

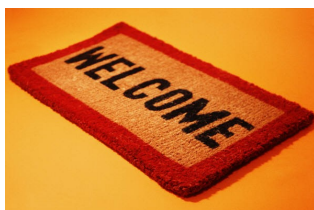

Communication clutter!

You will be happy to know that GCSAA “puts its money where its mouth is” and supports all employees to be active members of the American Society of Association Executives. It is the equivalent organization for people who work in the association management industry and provides very useful professional development, education resources, and a community to exchange ideas and expertise with other members. GCSAA has an Organizational Membership which allows all employees to utilize the asae.org website and access to all of these resources.

Recently, I took advantage of this opportunity and participated in a webinar titled “Breaking through the clutter – New, more effective ways to communicate with your members”. I chose that webinar because I believe communication is the most important tool that chapters utilize in all aspects of their chapter operations. It is the key to everything a chapter does from recruiting and retaining members to promoting attendance at chapter meetings. And honestly, something all chapters could improve.

The webinar was taught by Mr. Dave Stevens who is the Managing Partner of Stevens & Stevens, an award-winning company dedicated to helping associations improve their marketing and communications results. He did a great job and hit on several items that I believe can help chapters with their communication strategy. The information was also very useful in everyday communication whether you are dealing with golfers, customers, employees or coworkers, or even everyday interactions. Following are a few items that I thought interesting and useful.

Communication with members is now more difficult than ever. We have more technology and tools, but individuals are constantly bombarded by marketing and communication. The presenter compared the effort required by your members to find your message is similar to “Finding Waldo”. All of us are hit with hundreds of messages every day that include modern technology (email and social media), dynamic graphics, and “younger” and rebranded marketing.

Here are a few short and concise bullets of other useful items and tips:

- o Keep your messages short and concise – bite size
- o Use simple graphics in groupings
- o Tolerance for long text is very low – use text as if it is only being skimmed
- o Differentiate yourself – focus on your unique benefits
- o Track your email open rate and unsubscribe results
- o Email subject lines are important – keep short but informative
- o Keep in mind that a very large amount of messages are now read on phones and mobile devices – use templates
